Auxiliary Report

Cottage Hospital Auxiliary celebrated their 50th anniversary in 2018. In January 1968 Cottage Hospital Auxiliary was formed to provide volunteer services and hospital work through fundraising, publicity, membership mailings or transportation committees.

Cottage Hospital Auxiliary was recognized by the New Hampshire Association of Hospital Auxiliaries for the 2018 Group of the Year Award. Cottage Hospital said there is no limit to Cottage Hospital Auxiliary's level of commitment, service and teamwork. They are the heart of the hospital, and raised \$18,500 over a two-year period.

A recruitment focus and initiative resulted in six new members. An informational evening meeting was planned with word-of-mouth

Fundraising endeavors resulted in \$9,800 being donated to the hospital for the purchase of a surgical smoke evacuator and a bariatric up-and- down examination table. The Third Annual "Big Ticket" Raffle was successful due to ticket sales and tremendous support from area

The Memory Tree continues to be successful, bringing in approximately \$500–\$600 annually.
